Richard Moller, after only his second year as head women's soccer coach at Vassar College, guided the Brewers to back-to-back post-season ECAC appearances, a program first. Prior to his appointment at Vassar, Moller was the top assistant at Dartmouth College, where he played an integral role in the Big Green's achievement of a top 20 national Division I ranking and an NCAA tournament bid in 2005.

As a player, Moller had an exceptional career at Towson State in Maryland, becoming the first Towson player to be named NSCAA All-American and NSCAA Scholar-Athlete All-American. He was the America East Conference Player of the Year in 1998.

After college, Moller was the #1 draft pick of the Maryland Mania, an A-League team associated with D.C. United, and the #1 draft pick of the Baltimore Blast of the Major Indoor Soccer League.

Moller, who grew up in Germany, started for the German Youth National Team for four years. He also played for I.F.C. Kaiserslautern, where he won the German Youth Championship. He holds UEFA B and UEFA C coaching licenses, both obtained in Germany.

Ashleigh Carter, a 2007 graduate of the University of North Carolina at Asheville, just completed her first season as an assistant women's soccer coach at Vassar College. At Asheville, Carter, a captain her senior year, was part of two Big South regular-season championship teams and won the Big South Tournament Championship in 2006. This win led to UNC-Asheville's first-ever NCAA tournament appearance. Ashleigh was a first-team All-Conference pick, the Big South Conference Tournament MVP, and team MVP in her illustrious career.

Carter worked for two summers at the UNC-Asheville soccer camp, under the direction of 1985 National Team member Coach Michelle Cornish, designing workouts, demonstrating technique, and evaluating player skill development.

The camp staff is comprised of collegiate coaches and players.

Camp Philosophy

The Elite Residential Academy is designed for the female soccer player who wants to play at the next level, and is willing to do what it takes to improve her game.

The camp environment, designed to replicate a typical Vassar College preseason week, will give elite campers a sneak preview of what is required of them to play in college.

Consequently, sessions will revolve around tactical development in small group and team environments.

The focus of the Academy is to continually place campers in competitive situations to challenge their skill development and evaluate their tactical decision making.

The coaching staff maintains a camper:coach ratio of 10:1 and is comprised of college coaches and players. A certified athletic trainer is on site at all times. Dormitories are monitored and travel to and from playing sites is supervised.

Campers receive a camp jersey, a water bottle, a soccer ball, and a written evaluation. They will experience campus-style dining and living.

Important Information

Campers come from all parts of the country and Vassar is within range of several airports. NYC-area airport arrivals should take the Metro North railroad to Poughkeepsie and arrange pick up with us from the station ahead of time. Stewart Airport pickup is also available.
