
The Mythology of Women and their Jewelry

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Wendy Doniger is a world famous scholar of religion who has published over thirty books in her career, including Asceticism and Eroticism in the Mythology of Siva, The Origins of Evil in Hindu Mythology and Women, Androgynes, and Other Mythical Beasts. Doniger is currently the editor of the journal, History of Religions. She recently has achieved a level of further notoriety after Penguin Press India decided to recall her book, The Hindus: An Alternative History, after facing legal pressure from Hindu nationalists. Her book became the cause of free speech activists worldwide.
