Requirements for Chinese or Japanese Concentration/Major:

- 10 units (9 units if the student starts language study from CHIN 205 or 207/JAPA 205; 8 units if the student starts language study from CHIN 305/JAPA 305 or above) chosen from the Chinese-Japanese curriculum.
- Three units must be language courses at advanced level
- Three units must be content courses, of which one should be 300 level.
- Four additional electives such as: CHIN 105, 106, 107, 108, 205, 206, 207, 208/JAPA 105, 106, 205, 206.
- Intensives – none required, however, Senior Project or Senior Thesis are optional intensives.
- One non-departmental course from the approved course list can be taken to fulfill the major requirements.
- Courses taken under the Non-Recorded Option cannot serve to fulfill the requirements. Courses that are ungraded (such as Independent Study and Field Work) cannot count toward the major.
- For students seeking to double major in Chinese and Japanese, no more than two units may be double counted.
- Junior Year Abroad and summer courses may substitute for the required courses only with prior approval from the department. The department strongly encourages students to study abroad in China or Japan and commits to providing students with supervised study away programs.

Honors Requirements:

Students who wish to be considered for departmental honors must complete a thesis or project of sufficient quality. Students are required to have at least a 3.6 major GPA. A thesis is normally written in both semesters of the senior year. A senior project may be done either as a one-unit course in one semester, or a half-unit course in each of two semesters.

Departmental courses are arranged in three groups: 1) courses in Chinese-Japanese literary and cultural studies (CHJA); 2) courses in Chinese language and literary/cultural studies (CHIN); and 3) courses in Japanese language and literary/cultural studies (JAPA).
